

SOC FIVE Regional GMIT Data Expectations Tip Sheet

The following data are needed for the SOC-FIVE grant reporting requirements. These are continuous quality improvement (CQI) measures.

Data from DCBS:

1. Number of policy changes¹
2. Number of people reached through outreach efforts²
3. Number of DCBS screeners completed
4. Number of children/youth for whom the parent/guardian refused or denied the DCBS screener
5. Number of children/youth referred for a CANS assessment based on the DCBS screener
6. Number of children/youth who did not screen in for the CANS assessment
7. Number of children/youth for whom the parent/guardian refused or denied the CANS assessment

Data from behavioral health providers:

1. Number of policy changes¹
2. Number of people reached through outreach efforts²
3. Number of initial CANS assessments completed
4. Number of children/youth not referred to services or treatment* based on the CANS
5. Number of children/youth referred to services or treatment* based on the CANS
6. Number of children/youth receiving services or treatment* after referral (based on the CANS)

*This includes both high-need and other behavioral health services offered by the provider.

Data Collection:

The UK HDI Evaluation Unit collects these data monthly. HDI emails agencies requests at the end of each month. Here is a link to the survey to gather the above-listed data:

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¹This measure is operationalized as the number of regional policy changes created that will enhance the pace and quality of the SOC-FIVE implementation. Policy is a written document directing an action or event. Examples-- Directives, Guidance, Clinical practice guidelines, Operational manuals, Procedures, Bylaws, Strategic plans, Mission statements, Written decisions, Standards.

²The intent is to capture information on engagement with individuals using outreach or other strategies to increase participation of and access to treatment services for the population in focus as a result of the grant.
